

There is no god but Allah; none knows the unseen except Allah. There is no god but Allah; none forgives sins except Allah. There is no god but Allah; none manages the affairs except Allah. There is no god but Allah; none extends provision except Allah. There is no god but Allah; none frees the slaves but Allah.

O Allah, send prayers upon our beloved Prophet Muhammad, peace and blessings be upon him.

O Allah, grant us faith with no doubt, provision with no denial, honor with no humiliation, knowledge with no misguidance, a heart with no hardness, a tongue with no idle speech, vision with no betrayal, satisfaction with no displeasure, health with no sickness, well-being with no change, blessings with no loss. Encompass us in Your mercy, O Most Merciful of the merciful.

Our Lord, our Lord, tonight we seek Your noble face. We come to You with mountains of sins, with burdens that remain, with heavy illnesses, and unspoken wrongdoings. Our conditions are exposed. We ask You, O Allah, on this most blessed and hopeful night, while clinging to Your name, the Most Merciful—O Lord of Ramadan, O Lord of the Qur'an, O Lord of charity and kindness—make us rejoice tonight with relief, healing, forgiveness, freedom from Hellfire, and grant us the highest gardens of Paradise.

O Allah, we ask You on the night of gifts and generosity, when the mosque and surroundings are filled, hope overwhelms the hearts, du'as ascend, and joy mixes with weeping—O King of Kings, O King of Kings—send upon us complete pardon, noble forgiveness, and collective emancipation from the Fire.

O Allah, we ask You for the best of what the prophets of firm resolve asked You, and we seek refuge in You from the worst of what they sought refuge from. Our Lord, we raise our hands in supplication—make us among the people of the Prophet’s basin and intercession. Let us die upon the creed of Ahl al-Sunnah wal-Jama’ah, and make us among those freed from the Fire in this very hour, by Your mercy, O Most Merciful of the merciful, O Ever-Living, O Sustainer.

O Allah, whoever is present among us, or said “Ameen” to our du’a, or saw us, or recommended us, O Allah, if any of them is sick or has a sick loved one, heal them, heal their sick, grant them wellness and cure. Especially our parents, our siblings, our spouses, our sons and daughters, and all our relatives.

O Allah, O Lord of Ayyub (peace be upon him), they have been touched by hardship, and You are the Most Merciful of the merciful. O Ever-Living, O Sustainer. Unite and bring joy to every mother with her children, and every father with his sons. Rectify our homes, and keep them safe from disasters and tragedies. O our Lord, we’ve been told that Your mercy precedes Your wrath, and that You love forgiveness more than punishment.

So we call upon You with what You love to be called with tonight: O Allah, indeed You are Pardoning and You love to pardon, so pardon us, pardon us, pardon us. O You who gives protection and no one can protect against You—grant us protection from Hellfire, over and over.

O Allah, calm our fears and grant us safety when cries rise and screams echo, when groaning and shouting fill the night—calm our fears and protect us. Have mercy on our weakness when You split the skies with clouds and angels

descend, when standing becomes long, feet tire, and bodies are bare. There is no god but Allah.

O Allah, calm our fears when Hell is brought forth, dragged by seventy thousand reins, with each rein held by seventy thousand angels. And on that day, it will exhale and roar. There is no god but Allah.

O Allah, have mercy on us when the young turn gray, and wailing grows louder, and our loved ones turn away. Protect us from disgrace and the torment of Hellfire when the righteous are separated from the wicked, and the horrors are terrifying.

O Allah, protect us with Your mercy. We've been told that everyone has a seat written for them in Hell and one in Paradise. O Allah, we plead with You like the drowning, like the burning, like the heavy-hearted. We come to You with our fathers and mothers, our spouses, children, siblings, relatives, neighbors, the healthy and the sick, the rich and the poor, the young and the old, those who thought well of us, and those deceived by our appearance.

We plead to You with all forms of pleading—do not make any one of us destined for Hellfire. O Allah, whoever said “Ameen,” O You who erase what You will and affirm what You will—erase our seats from Hellfire and affirm our seats in Paradise. O Mighty, O Forgiving, include us all in forgiveness, in well-being, in overflowing blessings, and in a pure noble life.

Accept our prayers, our supplications, our fasting, our charity, our deeds. Do not take our good deeds away. Admit us into every good You admitted Muhammad ﷺ into, and protect us from every evil You protected Muhammad ﷺ from.

O Allah, open the door of repentance tonight, for all who repent, men and women, sinners—You say: “Whoever repents after wrongdoing and reforms, then Allah will turn to him.” And we have repented after our wrongdoing, so have mercy on us.

If we are not worthy, You say: “And He is ever Merciful to the believers”—and we are believers, so have mercy on us.

If we are not worthy, You say: “My mercy encompasses all things”—and we are among those things, the smallest and weakest of them. So have mercy on us.

If we are not worthy, then what calamity is greater than ours? That Your vast mercy would be too narrow for us?

O our Lord, You say: “Those who, when afflicted with calamity, say, ‘Indeed we belong to Allah and to Him we shall return’—they are the ones upon whom are blessings and mercy from their Lord.”

And here we are, repeating what You taught us: **Indeed, we belong to Allah and to Him we shall return.** So have mercy on us through it, O Allah.

O Allah, if in Your eternal knowledge, this night is Laylatul Qadr—then rectify all our affairs, and the affairs of the Muslims. Honor us with its virtue, light, victory, freedom, blessings, protection, provisions, joy, ease, and return us to our homes as those whom You have freed. You have said: “Go, you are the freed ones,” by My honor and majesty, I will not reject your prayer.

O Allah, grant success, health, and joy to all who have given their time, wealth and efforts in service to this blessed mosque, to its visitors, and all who prayed in it—men and women. O Lord of the worlds, O One, O Majestic, O Finder—write for them the reward of every standing, bowing, and prostration.

O Allah, make this night a night of acceptance. Let us leave it as if we were just born—sinless, worry-free, burden-free, pain-free. By Your mercy, O Most Merciful, accept from us. Do not turn us away. Do not reject us—for You are the Most Generous.
